Over 4200 kilograms of Environmental Waste Removed from Northern British Columbia Wild Sheep Society brings \$75,000 in Grant Aid towards Clean Up

Victoria, British Columbia- September 2, 2022

In August of 2022, The Wild Sheep Society of BC was proud to lend assistance in the form of \$75,000 in grantaid to a multi-stake and title holder clean up project in Northern British Columbia, in the Gataga River area. In 2017, President J. Fulton and Director T. Fulton of the executive of Northeast BC Wildlife Fund (NBCWF) were informed by Ms. Inge-Jean Hansen (FLNRORD) of locations in the Gataga River basin where a variety of waste was abandoned in the pristine valley.

Kyle Stelter, CEO of The Wild Sheep Society of BC stated "We are pleased to partner to support the Gataga River Watershed Clean up. With a \$150,000 budget, this collaboration restores habitat in the heart of mountain ungulate range. Our members are deeply committed to wild sheep, and this is an important project that will reap rewards for years to come."

In total, 2,340kg of fuel drums and 1,896kg of other waste was removed from an abandoned mine site. This included over 100 fuel drums and various other items from an area used by thinhorn stone's sheep, northern mountain caribou, and other wildlife. Waste was piled in a central location, slung to the Alaska highway via helicopter, loaded onto trailers, and trucked to the Fort Nelson dump for proper disposal.

Northeast BC Wildlife Fund was the lead on this critical project, and supported by Fabled Copper Corp., North Country Projects Ltd. (NCPL), Shifting Mosaics Consulting (SMC), Northern Fire WoRx Corp. (NFWRx), Stone and Folding Mountain Outfitters, and Qwest Helicopters (Qwest), and The Northern Rockies Regional Municipality (NRRM), as well as the Wild Sheep Society of British Columbia.

We acknowledge the financial support of the Province of British Columbia and are grateful to all the stake and title holders that made this happen.
